# NOTICE TO OWNERS OF SHIPS REGISTERED IN PART B OF THE NEW ZEALAND REGISTER OF SHIPS

## 1. REGISTRATION OF SHIPS IN NEW ZEALAND

Legislation concerning the registration of ships in New Zealand is contained in the Ship Registration Act 1992.

## 2. CERTIFICATE OF NEW ZEALAND REGISTRATION

The Certificate of New Zealand Registration should accompany the ship and be carefully preserved. It shall only be used for the lawful navigation of the ship and shall not be subject to detention by reason of any title, lien, charge or interest had or claimed by the owner or other person to, on, or in the ship. It must be delivered on demand to the person entitled to its custody for the purposes of the lawful navigation of the ship, the Registrar/Deputy Registrar of Ships, Collector of Customs, or any other person entitled by law to require its delivery.

The Certificate of New Zealand Registration is not evidence of title. Its purpose is to be a document always accompanying the ship to indicate its nationality.

## 3. PERIOD OF REGISTRATION

The registration of a ship in Part B:

- is effective for a period of 5 years from the date of registration, unless sooner terminated as detailed below.
- terminates upon any alteration to the ship or in its ownership that materially affects the particulars entered on the Certificate of Registration.

## 4. RENEWAL OF REGISTRATION

Registration in Part B may be renewed if:

- application in the prescribed form is made by the registered owner during the period of six months prior to the date of expiry of the ship's current 5 year period of registration; and
- the Registrar of Ships is satisfied that the registration of the ship has not terminated and that the ship is still required or entitled to be registered in Part B; and
- any changes in the particulars of the ship have been notified to the Registrar.

Upon renewal, a new Certificate of Registration will be issued by the Registrar which will be effective for a period of 5 years from the date of expiry of the current registration.

Where the registration is renewed, or the ship is re-registered within 6 months after the expiration of its previous registration, the ship will retain its previous registration number.

## 5. FLAGS TO BE FLOWN

- i) New Zealand registered ships, other than New Zealand Government ships, must fly either the New Zealand Flag or the marine flag of New Zealand, but shall not fly both flags. The marine flag of New Zealand is the red ensign usually worn by merchant ships registered in the United Kingdom, with the addition on the fly of the Southern Cross as represented by four 5-pointed white stars.
- ii) New Zealand Government ships must fly the New Zealand Flag.
